

Advent hope

Penitential Rite

The priest (or deacon) invites the people to confess their sins After a brief silence all say:

**Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
we have sinned against you and against our neighbour
in thought and word and deed,
through negligence, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us,
forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you
in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen**

The priest recalls the Last Supper

One of these four acclamations is used

[Great is the mystery of faith:]

Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

[Christ is the bread of life:]

All When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory.

[Praise to you, Lord Jesus:]

All Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory

[Jesus Christ is Lord:]

All Lord, by your cross and resurrection

you have set us free.

You are the Saviour of the world



The Prayer continues and leads into the doxology, to which all respond boldly **Amen.**

As Jesus taught us so we pray
**Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,

for ever and ever. Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

The priest breaks the consecrated bread.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ

Though we are many we are one body because we all share in one bread
